Recipe of the Month

This recipe comes to us from Pam Fuchs, whose Banana Bread comes highly recommended.

Banana Bread

Ingredients:

- 2 Cups flour
- 3/4 Cup brown sugar, packed
- 1 Tsp. baking soda
- 2 Eggs, beaten
- 1/4 Tsp. salt
- 2 Cups mashed overripe bananas
- 1/2 Cup butter
- 1/2 Cup chopped pecans or walnuts

Best results if ingredients are at room temperature.

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350
Lightly grease a 9" x 5" loaf pan.
In a large bowl combine flour, baking soda and salt. In another bowl, cream butter and brown sugar. Stir in beaten banana and eggs. Pour banana mixture into flour and mix to just moistened. Pour in loaf pan.
Bake 60 -65 minutes, until toothpick comes out clean when inserted into center of loaf. Cool 10 minutes in pan then turn out onto a wire rack.
This is really good toasted and topped with cream cheese.
